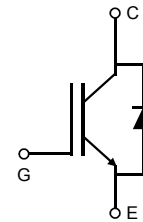
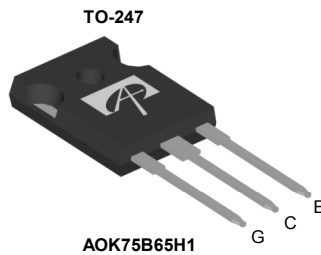

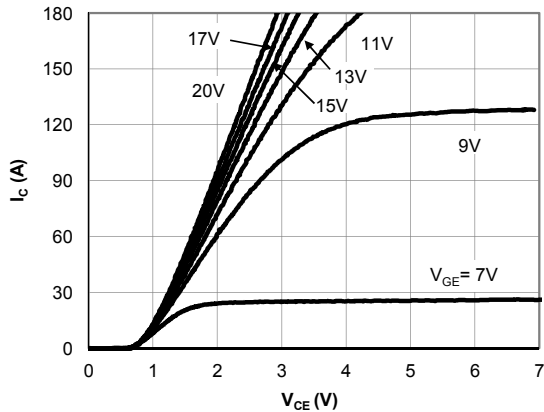


Figure 1: Output Characteristic
($T_j=25^\circ\text{C}$)

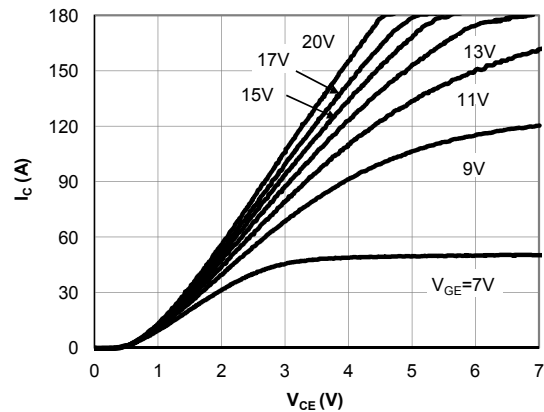


Figure 2: Output Characteristic
($T_j=175^\circ\text{C}$)

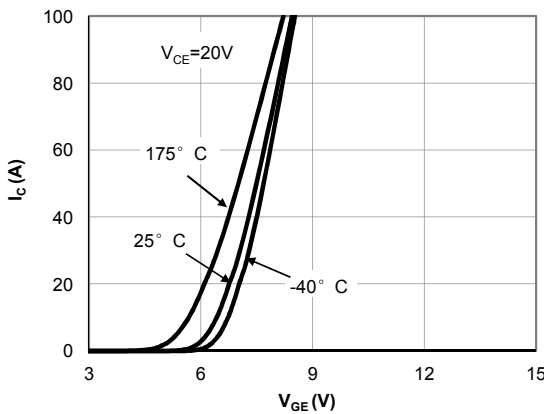


Figure 3: Transfer Characteristic

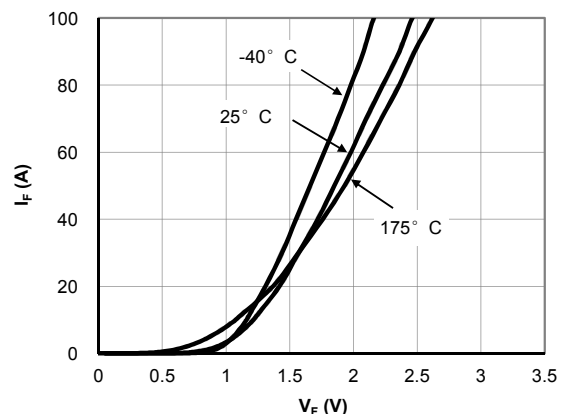


Figure 4: Diode Characteristic

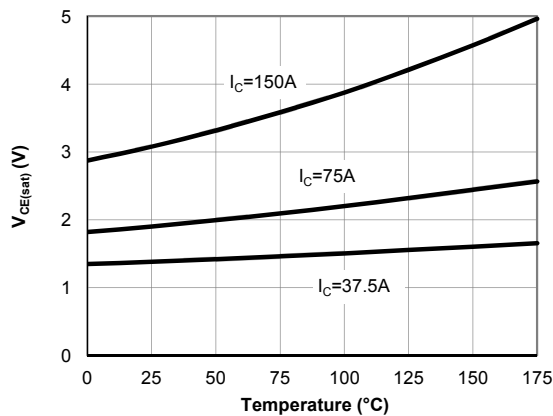


Figure 5: Collector-Emitter Saturation Voltage vs. Junction Temperature

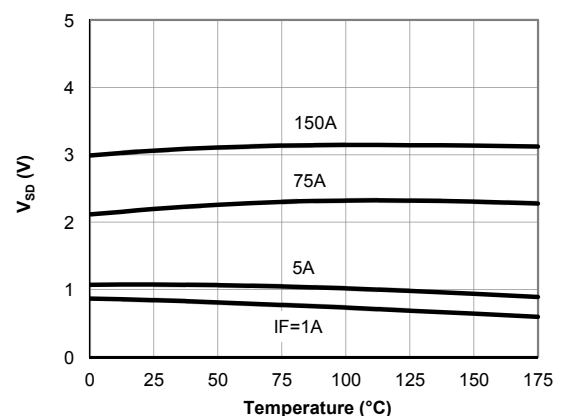


Figure 6: Diode Forward voltage vs. Junction Temperature

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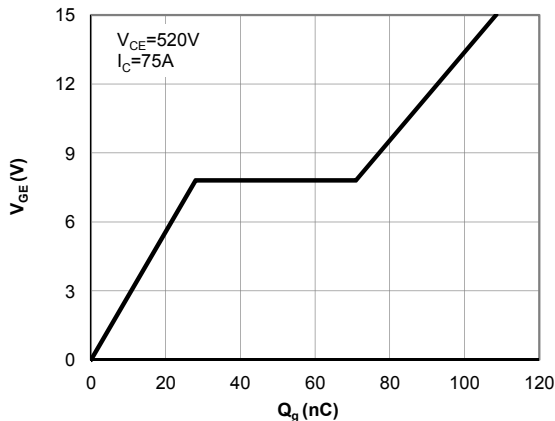


Figure 7: Gate-Charge Characteristics

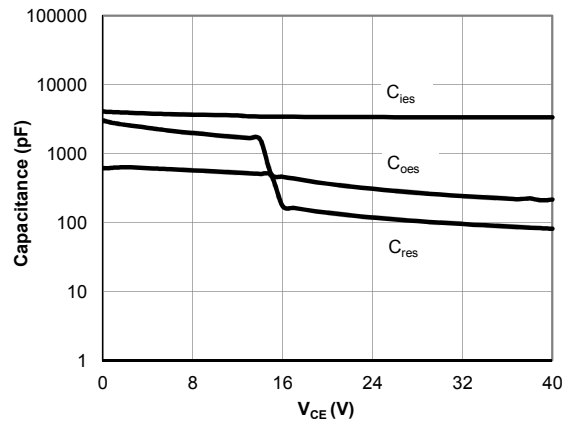


Figure 8: Capacitance Characteristic

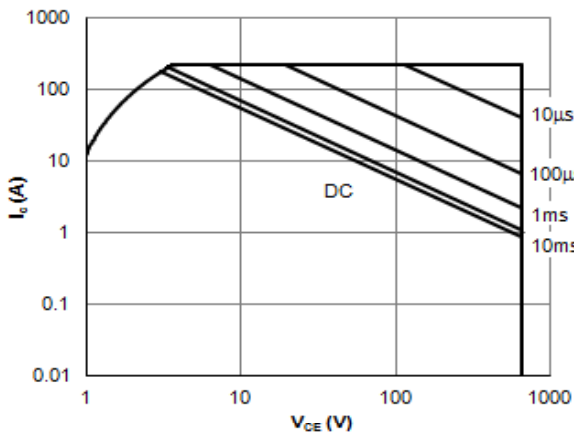


Figure 9: Forward Bias Safe Operating Area
($T_C=25^\circ\text{C}$, $V_{GE}=15\text{V}$)

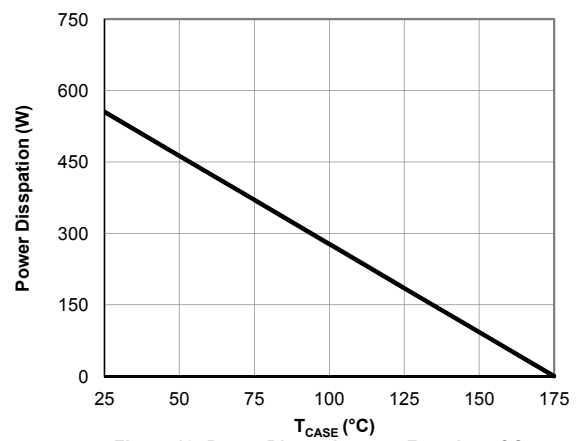


Figure 10: Power Dissipation as a Function of Case

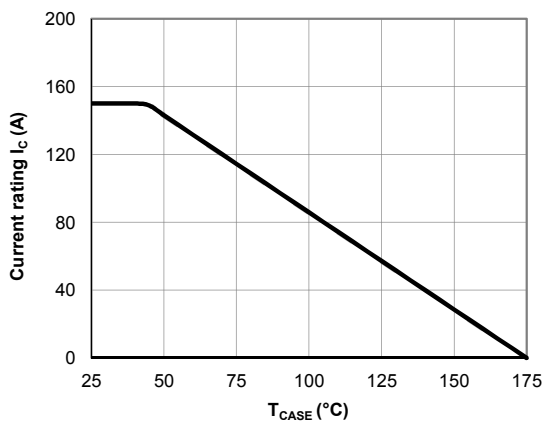


Figure 11: Current De-rating

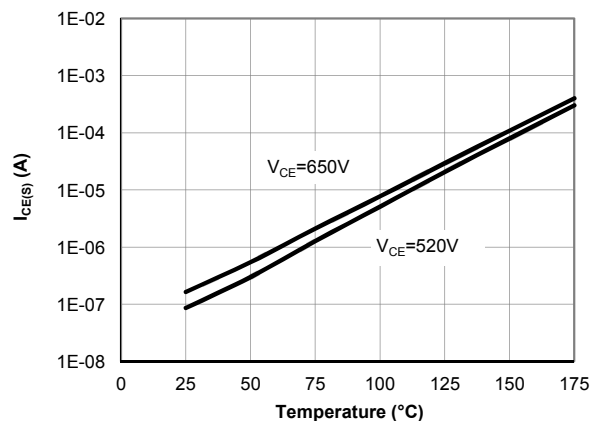


Figure 12: Diode Reverse Leakage Current vs. Junction Temperature

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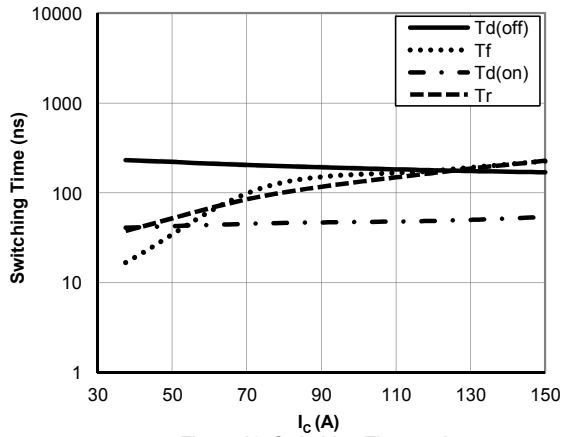


Figure 13: Switching Time vs. I_C

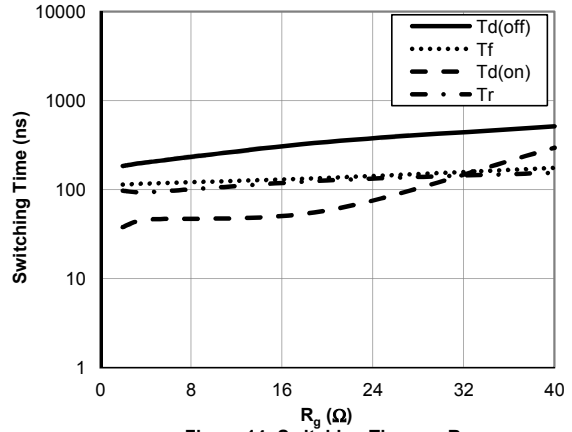


Figure 14: Switching Time vs. R_g

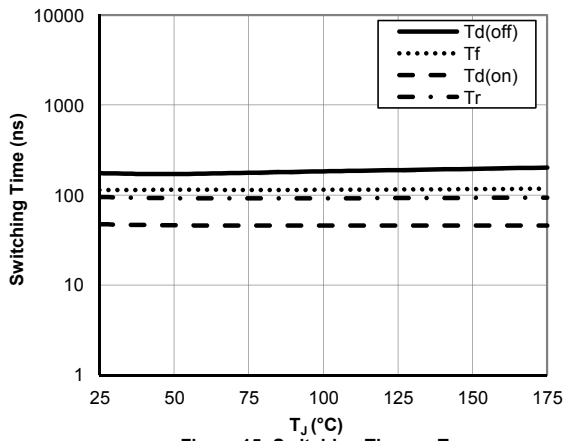


Figure 15: Switching Time vs. T_J
($V_{GE}=15\text{V}$, $V_{CE}=400\text{V}$, $I_C=75\text{A}$, $R_g=4\Omega$)

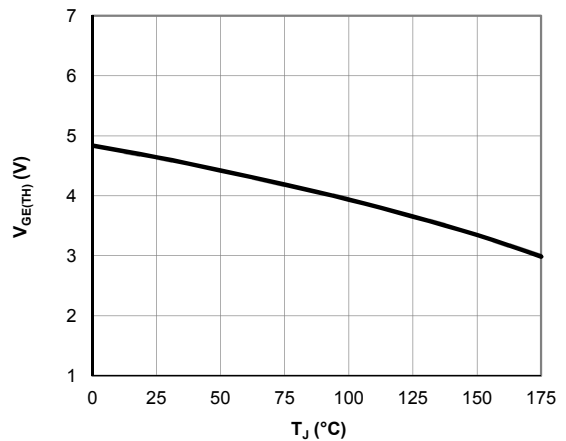


Figure 16: $V_{GE(TH)}$ vs. T_J

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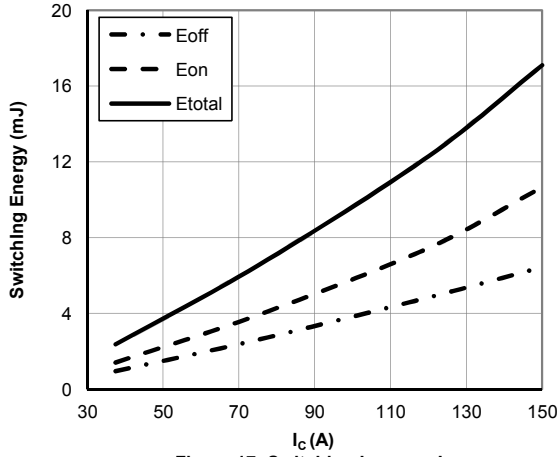


Figure 17: Switching Loss vs. I_C

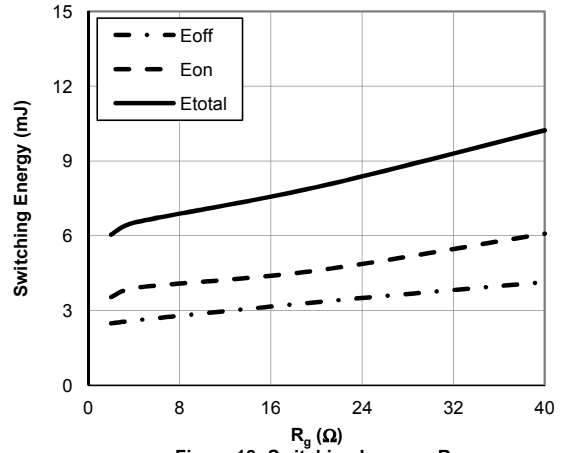


Figure 18: Switching Loss vs. R_g

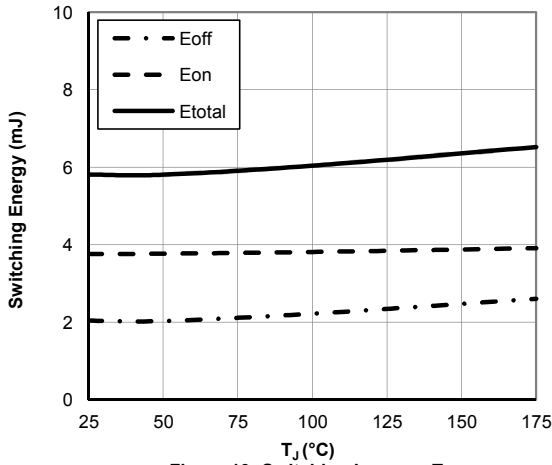


Figure 19: Switching Loss vs. T_J
($V_{GE}=15\text{V}$, $V_{CE}=400\text{V}$, $I_C=75\text{A}$, $R_g=4\Omega$)

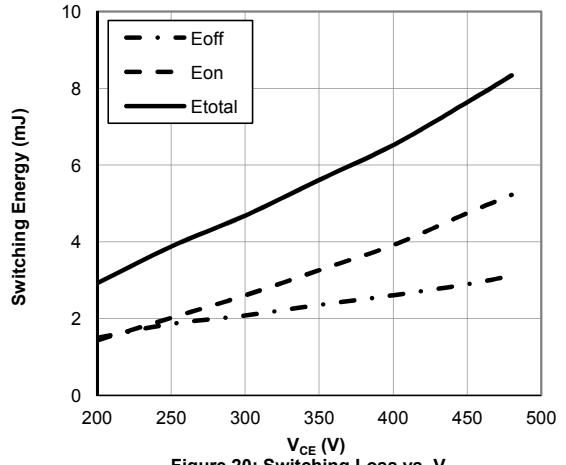


Figure 20: Switching Loss vs. V_{CE}
($T_J=175^\circ\text{C}$, $V_{GE}=15\text{V}$, $I_C=75\text{A}$, $R_g=4\Omega$)

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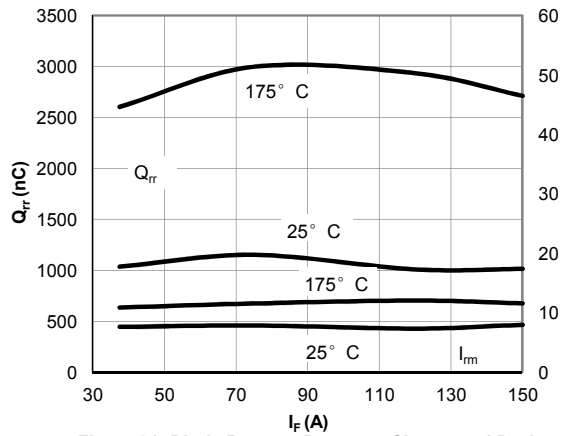


Figure 21: Diode Reverse Recovery Charge and Peak Current vs. Conduction Current
 ($V_{GE}=15V, V_{CE}=400V, di/dt=200A/\mu s$)

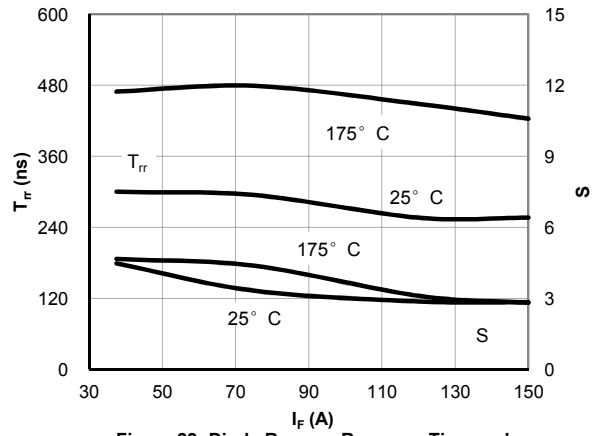


Figure 22: Diode Reverse Recovery Time and Softness Factor vs. Conduction Current
 ($V_{GE}=15V, V_{CE}=400V, di/dt=200A/\mu s$)

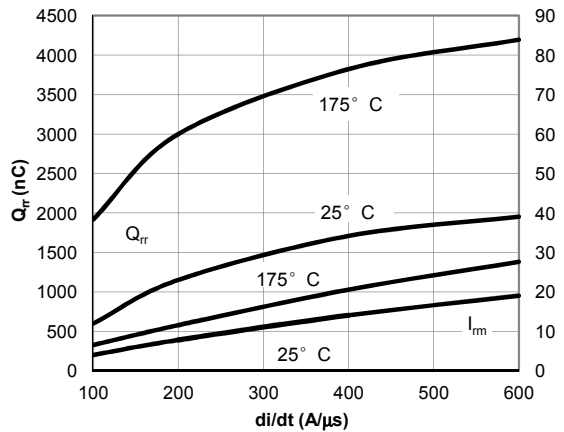


Figure 23: Diode Reverse Recovery Charge and Peak Current vs. di/dt
 ($V_{GE}=15V, V_{CE}=400V, I_F=75A$)

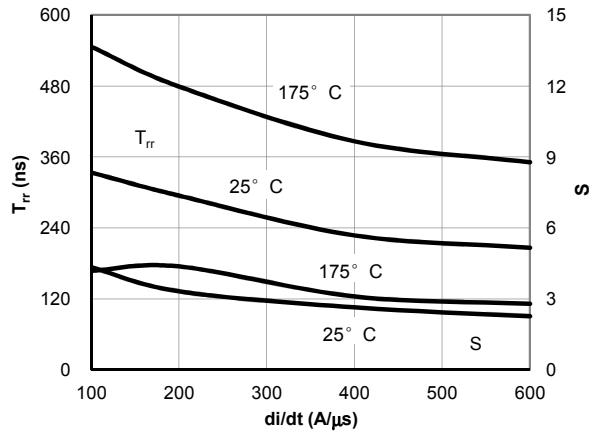


Figure 24: Diode Reverse Recovery Time and Softness Factor vs. di/dt

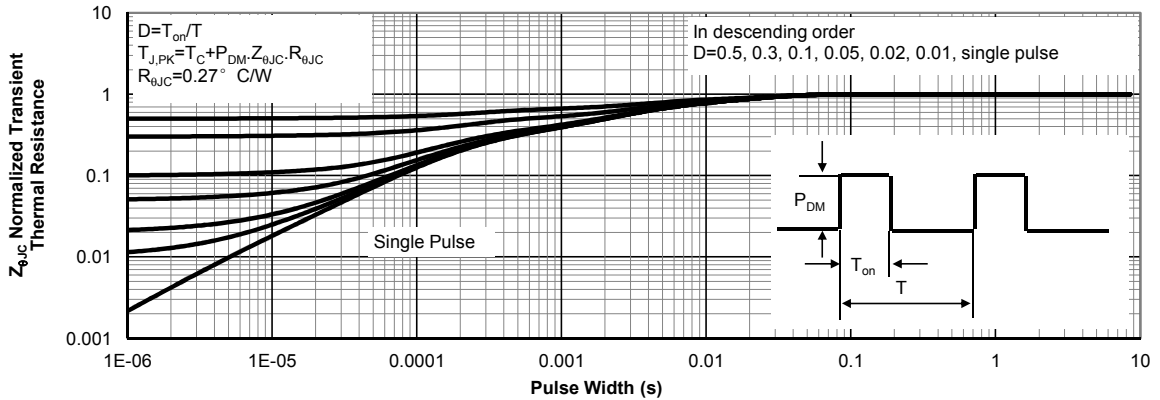


Figure 25: Normalized Maximum Transient Thermal Impedance for IGBT

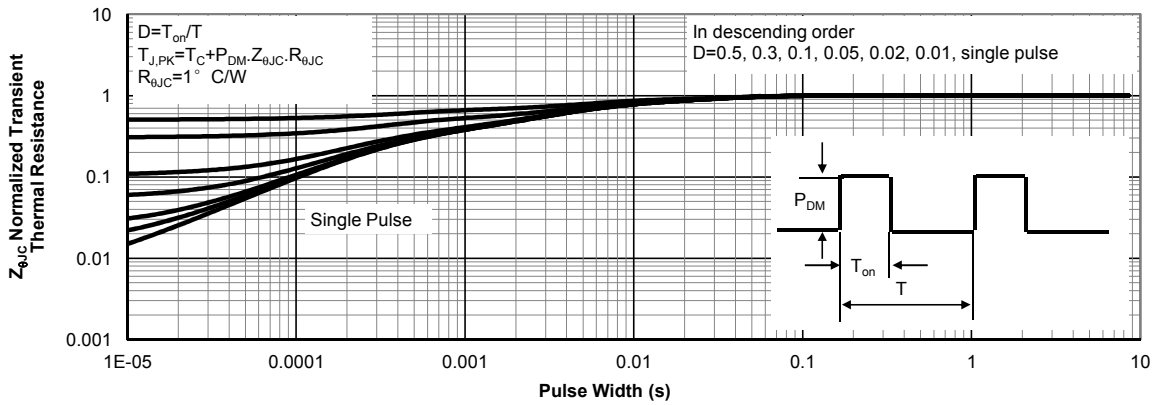


Figure 26: Normalized Maximum Transient Thermal Impedance for Diode
